

## **Activity Report of the Foreign Policy Association (APE)**

*Reporting Period: January – December 2024*

### **I. APE's Research Activities**

During the reporting period, the APE undertook the following activities in line with its objectives:

- Prepared and published 12 monthly bulletins featuring summaries and debates on foreign policy (FES/APE Monthly Bulletin); these were published and distributed electronically to over 1,000 subscribers representing various target groups (Annex 1).
- Prepared and published 6 editions of the Security and Defense Monitoring of the Republic of Moldova (BREN/APE Monthly Monitor) (Annex 1).
- Prepared and edited 5 informative and analytical bulletins on the European path of the Republic of Moldova (USAID/APE Monthly Bulletin) and 3 youth-oriented bulletins (PIN/APE Monthly Bulletin) (Annex 1).
- Developed and published 16 analyses and studies on topics including: National security; Moldova's response to the consequences of the war in Ukraine; The importance of minimizing information security risks in the Republic of Moldova amid hybrid threats; Security in the Black Sea region; Development of Moldova-Poland relations in the context of Moldova's EU accession process; Electoral processes in the Republic of Moldova (Annex 1).
- Participated in over 47 events, including conferences, roundtable discussions, consultations, webinars, meetings, and national and international debates (Annex 1).
- Conducted interviews for local television stations featuring members of the Association (Annex 1).
- Maintaining and regularly updating the APE website ([www.ape.md](http://www.ape.md)), which features studies, publications, and commentaries, as well as press releases about events organized by the APE.
- Updating the APE Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/ape.md>), where APE experts share brief information about analytical materials and studies, interviews, completed projects, press releases, as well as media content from events. This platform is also used to maintain communication with the Association's target group.

- Collaborating with the team from the Center for Training and Organizational Consultancy (CICO), supported by the U.S. Embassy in Moldova, to review and develop internal documents, and improve the financial policies and procedures of the NGO "Foreign Policy Association" (APE) for the 2024–2025 period.

## II. Project Implementation Activities:

### 1. Completion of the BREN Project: "Strengthening Civil Society Engagement in Protecting National Security Amid New Hybrid Threats"

This project includes various activities such as brainstorming sessions, consultations with representatives of state institutions and civil society, workshops with partners, training sessions to enhance media literacy among youth, webinars, and roundtables. The focus is on bolstering the national security of the Republic of Moldova in the context of the war in Ukraine. Additionally, the publication of monthly monitoring and analysis bulletins on Moldova's security and defense policy has been launched. The Security Monitor will be updated monthly to reflect relevant dynamics in the field and highlight the most pressing challenges. This initiative aims to contribute to a broader understanding of the security sector and provide a detailed analysis of the situation across the country. It seeks to enhance resilience and ensure a prompt response to emerging hybrid threats. Furthermore, the most significant findings will be presented through interactive infographics, designed to systematize the main developments in the fields of security and defense.

The project is implemented by the APE in partnership with *Nord News*, the European Center "Pro-Europe" in Comrat, and *Zona de Securitate*. It is funded through a grant from the Institute for War and Peace Reporting (IWPR) with support from the United Kingdom's Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO).

### 2. Completion of the "Hope" Project: The Second Edition of the School for Young Women Leaders from Both Banks of the Dniester River / U.S. Department of State

The primary aim of the project was to recruit and develop a network of young women leaders from both banks of the Dniester River and empower them to take on leadership roles in the political, social, and economic life of the Republic of Moldova. The project recruited 30 young women from both sides of the Dniester River, providing them with extensive theoretical knowledge and practical skills in leadership, communication, and negotiation, as well as individual mentorship tailored to their professional journeys and leadership roles.

The *Hope School* includes both theoretical sessions and practical training workshops, along with individualized mentoring. Eight working sessions are planned to take place in the nation's capital, involving participants from both sides of the Dniester River.

**Session Themes:** The current state of representation and the status of women in leadership roles globally and in the Republic of Moldova; Leadership vision, the concept of leadership, values, challenges, and responsibilities of a leader; Leadership in political and social life - women's participation in politics and social activities; Women's participation in economic life and wage disparities; Leadership tools for women - understanding the value of gender rights as part of human rights, contrasted with entrenched attitudes and stereotypes; Leadership tools for

women - professional and personal communication skills; Leaders and creating a leadership image in traditional media and social media. Women leaders and their portrayal in the media; Balancing professional and personal life for women. Career growth for women, combined with family and motherhood responsibilities. The project is funded by the U.S. Embassy in Moldova.

### **3. Completion of the Project: "Advancing Moldova's Preparation for European Integration," USAID**

The primary goal of this project is to promote positive messages about European integration and increase citizen support for a European and democratic Moldova. The focus is on facilitating communication between representatives of state institutions, civil society, and citizens to familiarize them with the EU accession process. This also aims to enhance public support for Moldova's European path. Thematic events, including TV programs broadcast through media outlets across different regions (TV Nord, Drochia TV, Nokta, Elita TV, Studio-L, IPN), informative videos, interactive sessions in various localities, workshops with participants from across the country, and informational materials are designed to foster effective dialogue. These efforts aim to communicate the benefits of EU membership while combating existing stereotypes and prejudices.

### **4. Implementation of the NATO Project: "School for Security and Resilience"**

The proposed project, *"Autumn School for Security and Resilience,"* aims to provide young participants - future specialists in international relations - with comprehensive knowledge and practical skills in security and defense culture. It also includes individual coaching on their career paths and leadership roles in society. The project addresses various aspects of security, focusing on topics such as national security and defense, energy resilience, information security, stable communities, and risk prevention.

### **5. Continuation and Completion of the Project: "Discussions on Moldova's European Path – Part 2," USAID**

The main objective of this project is to promote positive messages about European integration and increase public support for a European and democratic Moldova. It emphasizes facilitating communication between state institutions, civil society, and citizens to enhance understanding of the EU accession process and increase public backing for Moldova's European trajectory.

### **6. Implementation of the Project: "Strengthening Civic Engagement of Youth for Moldova's Democratic Resilience and European Future," People in Need, Moldova ASSIST**

This project focuses on youth aged 18 and older, particularly those in regions with a high concentration of Russian speakers, including ethnic minorities and representatives of youth

organizations and movements. The primary objectives are to increase civic activism among youth, counter misinformation and propaganda, promote social cohesion and dialogue, and enhance media literacy and resilience against disinformation. To achieve these goals, the project will organize six media literacy trainings in local communities (Bălți, Edineț, Comrat, Taraclia, Dubăsari, Chișinău), educating at least 120 young people on media literacy and resilience against disinformation. Additionally, six workshops will be held in Chișinău, engaging youth from diverse backgrounds (ethnic minorities, Russian speakers, youth organizations) to promote dialogue and mutual understanding. Awareness campaigns will also be developed, including three video spots focusing on civic engagement and Moldova's democratic resilience.

- Expanding partnerships with organizations in Ukraine, Romania, Georgia, and Poland for the development and implementation of new projects.
- Enhancing internal documentation, improving APE's policies and financial procedures, and implementing the Strategic Development Plan for 2025–2026.
- Preparing and securing funding for project proposals aligned with APE's objectives to present to donors.
